


Upcoming Trail Closure:

The Perkiomen Trail, stretching from Harmon Road to Salford Street in Upper Salford Township, will be closed for approximately one to two weekday(s) in early-March due to final restoration work. The work will restore the trail to preexisting conditions prior to waterline installation. The exact day(s) will depend upon local weather conditions. The closure is expected to last from approximately 7:00 a.m. up to 4:00 p.m. The trail will be reopened immediately upon completion. Updates will be posted on various local media platforms to provide a more specific date as work continues moving forward on the project. The map below shows the section of the Perkiomen Trail that will be closed highlighted in yellow. The parking lot at William Rahmer Upper Salford Township Park will remain closed until completion of the waterline project. Please do not park in the park or on surrounding streets. Thank you for your cooperation.

In January 2022, approximately 1,800 feet of waterline was installed along the trail beginning at the Rahmer Park parking area near Harmon Road. The line currently ends in the trail and will be extended off the trail and through the parking area towards the baseball field. EPA is working closely with Montgomery County to ensure the public is notified of any impacts to trail use. Upper Salford Township, Lower Frederick Township, and the Schwenksville Water Authority are coordinating with EPA on the waterline work.

Site Background:

The site consists of a groundwater plume contaminated with volatile organic compounds (VOCs). The plume affects a small community of single family homes, a sizable number of which draw their water from a community well. A water pipeline is being constructed to allow residents affected by the VOC contamination access to clean water.
