2023 Balanced Budget Passed - NO TAX Increase, AGAIN! For the 19th consecutive year, the Upper Salford Township Tax Rate has remained the same! The prudent financial management of Upper Salford Township supervisors and staff results in no increased tax rates. The supervisors are proud to provide beautiful parks and trails and other recreational opportunities such as skiing and ice-skating activities, relaxing free township concerts as well as the Philadelphia Folk Festival. We are proud of our safe, peaceful, beautiful, and not overdeveloped township. We take care of our environment and open space to preserve our Quality of Life. Below are the 2022 accomplishments.

<u>COMPLETED:</u> Upper Salford Park to the Perkiomen Trail (P2P). The P2P from Upper Salford Park to Spring Mount Road to the Perkiomen Trail is OPEN. The 1.2-mile trail is a beautiful walk through nature and woods that connects two township assets (the park to the ski slope) then connects to a county asset the Perkiomen Trail. This is a great local and regional accomplishment. A formal ribbon cutting event is planned for April 2023.



<u>COMPLETED:</u> Upper Salford Township purchased a previously owned Rescue Truck and donated it to the Upper Salford Volunteer Fire Company. The fire company was grateful for the township's additional financial donation in 2022.



COMPLETED: Upgraded playground equipment including a 'crab trap' and a new climbing structure, was installed in the Upper Salford Park as part of the celebration of the park's 25th anniversary.

CONTINUED TRADITIONS: 2022 marked the return of the 60th Philadelphia Folk Festival at the Old Pool Farm. Yes, the Folk Festival was back – folk music under the stars of Upper Salford's dark night skies. The Upper Salford Citizen's Group's Annual Fourth of July Parade had a large 2022 turnout to participate as well as watch the parade. Truly a community event and tradition!

PENNDOT ROUNDABOUT UPDATE:

Work on the PennDOT and US Department of Transportation (US DOT) funded roundabout project between Shelly, Old Skippack and Schwenksville roads has begun. This Upper Salford Township intersection was considered dangerous by PennDOT, Montgomery County and the US DOT. A federal grant of \$2 million was awarded to PennDOT to construct this modern roundabout roadway improvement. This PennDOT project will improve the safety of our township.

According to studies by the IIHS and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) roundabouts typically achieve:

- a 37% reduction in overall collisions,
- a 75% reduction in injury collisions intersections where stop signs or traffic signals were previously used for traffic control,
- a 90% reduction in fatality collisions, and
- a 40% reduction in pedestrian collisions.

PENN DOT'S CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE: (SUBJECT TO CHANGE)

<u>Pre-stage 1</u> (Utility Works) Work Duration: 10/3/2022 to 2/10/2023. Flagging operation. NO ROAD CLOSURE <u>Stage-1 Construction:</u> Work Duration 2/15/2023 to 5/30/2023

 Shelly Road and Schwenksville Road to be closed and detoured from 2/15/2023 to 5/30/2023. Note: Old Skippack Road remains open.

Stage-2 Construction: Work Duration 5/30/2023 to 10/11/2024

- Entire intersection closed and detoured (Old Skippack Road and Schwenksville Intersection), starting 5/30/2023 anticipate to reopened by 7/13/2023.
- Install Planting and Landscaping 10/13/2023 to 11/14/2023
- Plant Establishment Period 11/15/2023 to 10/11/2024

RESIDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

<u>Township Septic Pumping Program</u>: It is your responsibility to pump your septic system once every 3 years to protect our well water and public health safety. You must provide a copy of the pumping receipt from the septic pumper to the Township office. Email reminders to pump are sent via email. Please help us to help you by sharing your email address with the township.

<u>Tree Removal:</u> Due to the increasing number of dead trees caused by Ash Bore disease, Lantern Flies, and other damages, residents are responsible for removing dead trees on your property next to roads before they become a safety hazard.

<u>Township Park Pavilion Reservations</u>: Begin February 1st Upper Salford Township is accepting reservations for the pavilion at Upper Salford Park for your private event. Please call the Township office for information, rental rates, and availability. NO alcohol is permitted in the park. <u>This year township residents will have a discounted rate for pavilion rentals</u>.

<u>Township Park Concert Series</u> Upper Salford Township Park Board plans to continue to offer three free concerts in the park in 2023. Check the Township website for concert details.

- The 25-year history of Upper Salford Park


- The 75-year history of the fire company
