The March meeting of the Upper Salford Board of Supervisors was brought to order by Chairman O'Donnell at 7:30 p.m. Messrs. Poatsy and Sacks were present, as well as the Township Solicitor, Stephen P. Imms, Jr.

The Board of Supervisors shared **public announcements**:

- The Board of Supervisors shared that they held an Executive Session prior to the meeting at the request of one of the Township employees.
- The Board of Supervisors presented a Certificate of Appreciation, along with a gift certificate, to honor **Marty Lynch for his 30 years of service to the Township**.
- The Board of Supervisors has been in constant communication with representatives from the EPA on the continuing work on the Baghurst remediation efforts.
- The Board of Supervisors shared that PennDOT will be holding a Virtual meeting (Teams Meeting) on March 12<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m. to share the plans for their proposed Route 63 Safety Improvements.
- The Upper Salford Volunteer Fire Company Ladies Auxiliary Penny Auction is being held on Saturday, March 16<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m.
- Spring Mountain Adventures is holding a 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration with fireworks at 9:00 p.m. They are celebrating 25 years since the cooperative agreement between the County, the Township, and Spring Mountain LLC.
- Upper Salford Township, in consultation with the Fire Chief, has initiated a Burn Ban as of today at 8:00 a.m. There shall be no open burning (including burn barrels) of any materials outside.

The following reports were presented for the month of February 2025: State Police, Upper Salford Volunteer Fire Company, Special Fire Police, Plymouth Community Ambulance Association, Freedom Valley Medical Rescue, Zoning Officer/Building Inspector, Road Superintendent, Solicitor, Historical Society, Residential Pumping Receipt Update, and Indian Valley Regional Planning Commission.

- After the Plymouth Community Ambulance Association Report, there was a lengthy discussion about the Montgomery County EMS Strategic Plan that was just completed and received.
- **During the Historical Society Report**, Pat Hughes shared that Aaron Heckler will be holding a presentation on local Amusement Parks on March 24<sup>th</sup> at 7pm at Tabor United Methodist Church, Perkiomen Railroad will present on April 28<sup>th</sup> at 7pm at Tabor United Methodist Church, and the Memorial Day Remembrance will be held on May 26<sup>th</sup> at 7pm at the Upper Salford Park.

**On a motion** made by Mr. Poatsy and seconded by Mr. Sacks, the Board of Supervisors unanimously approved to **amend the March 11**<sup>th</sup> **Agenda** to include consideration of the adoption of a **Burn Ban Resolution**.

On a motion by Mr. Sacks and seconded by Mr. Poatsy, the Board of Supervisors unanimously approved the adoption of Resolution #2025-4 Declaration of Burning Emergency.

• Pat Hughes, Church Road, inquired if there is a penalty if someone is caught burning during a ban and inquired if there is an email blast that could be sent, in addition to posting on the Township website, NextDoor, sign at the firehouse, etc.

**On a motion** made by Mr. Poatsy and seconded by Mr. Sacks, the Board of Supervisors unanimously awarded the contract for **Renewal of Bid #2024-1 Type II Slurry Seal/Crack Seal** with Asphalt Maintenance Solutions LLC until March 31, 2025, for the first (1<sup>st</sup>) year of a 3-year extension.

**On a motion** made by Mr. Poatsy and seconded by Mr. Sacks, the Board of Supervisors unanimously approved the **Renewal of Bid #2023-2 Ultra-Thin Bonded Wearing Course** with Asphalt Maintenance Solutions LLC until March 31, 2025, for the second (2<sup>nd</sup>) of a 3-year extension.

**On a motion** made by Mr. Poatsy and seconded by Mr. Sacks, the Board of Supervisors unanimously approved the bills for the month of March in the amount of \$95,772.72 for payment.

The receipts for the month of March totaled \$317,953.02.

The Treasurer's report as of March 11<sup>th</sup>, noted the following amounts: total assets, \$11,232,428.16; total liabilities, \$434,736.47; total equity, \$10,797,691.69. Total liabilities and equity equal \$11,232,428.16.

**On a motion** made by Mr. Sacks and seconded by Mr. Poatsy, the Board of Supervisors unanimously approved the minutes of the February 11, 2025 Board of Supervisors meeting as submitted.
