The June meeting of the Upper Salford Board of Supervisors was brought to order by Chairman O'Donnell at 7:30 p.m. Messrs. Poatsy and Sacks were present, as well as the Township Solicitor, Stephen P. Imms, Jr.

The Board of Supervisors shared **public announcements**:

- The Board of Supervisors has been in constant communication with representatives from the EPA on the continuing work on the Baghurst remediation efforts.
- The first concert of the season was held on June 5<sup>th</sup> featuring The Mighty Manatees in their 11<sup>th</sup> year. Mr. Poatsy shared that it was well attended and publicly thanked Tabor Church for supplying snacks for the evening.
- Perkiomen Valley Library will be holding Stories in the Park on July 10th at Upper Salford Park at 10am. The event is free to attend.
- Philadelphia Folk Festival will be held from August 15th to August 17th. Information regarding the Festival and ticket sales can be found on their website, folkfest.org.
- The 37<sup>th</sup> Annual Red, White, and Blue Parade will be held on July 4<sup>th</sup>.

The following reports were presented for the month of May 2025: State Police, Upper Salford Volunteer Fire Company, Special Fire Police, Plymouth Community Ambulance Association, Freedom Valley Medical Rescue, Zoning Officer/Building Inspector, Road Superintendent, Solicitor, Historical Society, Residential Pumping Receipt Update, and Indian Valley Regional Planning Commission.

## **Public Comment:**

 During the Historical Society report, Mr. Sacks shared that a private tour of the Hiester House was conducted on June 9<sup>th</sup>. The Annual Memorial Day event took place at Upper Salford Park.

On a motion made by Mr. Sacks and seconded by Mr. Poatsy, the Board of Supervisors unanimously authorized the Upper Salford Special Fire Police to assist at the Skippack 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade on Friday, July 4<sup>th</sup> and Limerick 4<sup>th</sup> of July Fireworks on Friday, July 4<sup>th</sup>, if they so choose and have the volunteers available.

Solicitor Imms has been in contact with the Schwenksville Borough Authority Solicitor about safety issues at the booster station facility. **On a motion** made by Mr. Poatsy and seconded by Mr. Sacks, the Board of Supervisors unanimously approved to **table the consideration of the Schwenksville Authority Easement Agreements** to a future date.

Chairman O'Donnell announced that Lori Smith, who served for nearly 18 years, has resigned from her position as deputy emergency management coordinator, for personal reasons. **On a motion** made by Mr. O'Donnell and seconded by Mr. Sacks, the Board of

Supervisors unanimously approved the **Appointment of Bryan Klock**, of Salford Station Road, to the position of **Deputy Emergency Management Coordinator**.

On a motion made by Mr. Poatsy and seconded by Mr. Sacks, the Board of Supervisors unanimously approved Resolution #2025-5, A Resolution of the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Upper Salford Providing for Auditor Compensation. Each Auditor elected after the effective date of this resolution shall be compensated at a rate of \$18.00 per hour, with total compensation not to exceed \$1,800.

On a motion made by Mr. Poatsy and seconded by Mr. Sacks, the Board of Supervisors unanimously approved the Advertisement for the Adoption of an Ordinance Amending the Annual Salary on a Monthly Basis. Act 94 of 2024 allows supervisors of townships with populations not exceeding 4,999 to receive compensation up to \$3,145 annually.

**On a motion** made by Mr. Poatsy and seconded by Mr. Sacks, the Board of Supervisors unanimously approved the bills for the month of June in the amount of \$91,958.89 for payment.

The receipts for the month of June totaled \$169,806.30.

The Treasurer's report as of June 10<sup>th</sup>, noted the following amounts: total assets, \$11,506,817.68; total liabilities, \$387,014.39; total equity, \$11,119,803.29. Total liabilities and equity equal \$11,506,817.68.

**On a motion** made by Mr. Sacks and seconded by Mr. Poatsy, the Board of Supervisors unanimously approved the minutes of the May 13, 2025 Board of Supervisors meeting as submitted.

## **Public Comment:**

• Tom Brown, Old Skippack Road, raised concerns regarding the abandoned communication lines that are hanging down in and around the Township.

**On a motion** made by Mr. O'Donnell and seconded by Mr. Poatsy, the meeting adjourned at 8:18 p.m.
