

March 10, 2026
Upper Salford, Pennsylvania

The March meeting of the Upper Salford Board of Supervisors was brought to order by Chairman Poatsy at 7:30 p.m. Messrs. O'Donnell and Sacks were present, as well as the Township Solicitor, Stephen P. Imms, Jr.

The Board of Supervisors shared **public announcements**:

- The Board of Supervisors received updates from the EPA on the continuing work on the Baghurst remediation efforts.
 - **Public Comment:**
Bill Roynan, Hendricks Station Road, had some inquiries regarding the Baghurst remediation project, particularly with the construction equipment. Mr. Sacks offered to discuss his questions and concerns directly after the meeting.
- Volunteers are needed to help plan the America250PA event in Upper Salford Park on October 26, 2026.
- Perkiomen Valley Library is temporarily moving to the Schwenksville Borough Building due to upcoming renovations beginning on February 25th.
- USVFC Ladies Auxiliary Penny Auction is on March 21, 2026. Doors open at 5:30pm.
- There is an Electronics Recycling Event being held at Living Hope Farm located at 461 Indian Creek Road on March 28th from 9am to 11am. No registration is required.

The following reports were presented for the month of February 2026: State Police, Upper Salford Volunteer Fire Company, Special Fire Police, Plymouth Community Ambulance Association, Freedom Valley Medical Rescue, Joint Board Meeting, Zoning Officer/Building Inspector, Road Superintendent, Solicitor, Historical Society, Residential Pumping Receipt Update, and Indian Valley Regional Planning Commission.

- ***During the Historical Society Report, Pat Hughes shared that they have lined up presenters for the March and April Historical Society Meetings. Both presentations will be held on the 4th Monday of each month at Tabor Church at 7pm.***

Aileen Johnson, Branch Manager, and Don Barrick, Representative, of the **Perkiomen Valley Library**, gave a presentation and discussed various events that the library is holding for their members this year, as well as some incentives that the library offers. They also provided an update about ongoing renovations that have been supported by an LSA Grant. The Board of Supervisors presented their annual donation check to Ms. Johnson.

Public Comment:

- *Tom Brown, Old Skippack Road, suggested checking with school districts for furniture and shelving.*

Honoring Andrew Braunfeld will be **tabled** until the Board meeting in April.

On a motion made by Mr. Sacks and seconded by Mr. O'Donnell, the Board of Supervisors unanimously authorized the **Upper Salford Special Fire Police** to assist at the **Lower Frederick Township** with the following events, **Egg Hunt on April 4th**, **Spring Festival on May 9th**, and the **Concerts in Cuddy Park on July 23rd and on August 27th**, if they choose and have the volunteers available.

The following duly advertised sealed bid for **Bituminous Seal Coat (Oil & Chip)** was received and opened during the meeting:

On a motion made by Mr. Sacks and seconded by Mr. O'Donnell, the Board of Supervisors unanimously accepted the contract for Bituminous Seal Coat (Oil & Chip) (**Bid #2026-1**) from April 1, 2026 to March 31, 2027 to the lowest responsible bidder, **Asphalt Maintenance Solutions LLC**, pending the recommendation by the Solicitor and the Road Master.

On a motion made by Mr. Sacks and seconded by Mr. O'Donnell, the Board of Supervisors unanimously approved the bills for the month of March in the amount of \$114,575.69 for payment.

The receipts for the month of March totaled \$333,502.91.

The Treasurer's report as of March 10, 2026, noted the following amounts: total assets, \$11,201,306.37; total liabilities, \$378,663.23; total equity, \$10,822,643.14. Total liabilities and equity equal \$11,201,306.37.

On a motion made by Mr. Sacks and seconded by Mr. O'Donnell, the Board of Supervisors unanimously approved the minutes of the February 10, 2026 Board of Supervisors meeting as submitted.
