

May 12, 2026
Upper Salford, Pennsylvania

The May meeting of the Upper Salford Board of Supervisors was brought to order by Mr. O'Donnell at 7:30 p.m. Mr. Sacks was present, as well as the Township Solicitor, Stephen P. Imms, Jr. Mr. Poatsy was absent.

The Board of Supervisors shared **public announcements**:

- The closeout of the DCNR Grant application for the Open Space Acquisition has been completed. Payment is expected to be received in 6 to 8 weeks. We are awaiting the grant funds from the Montgomery County Open Space Board.
- The Board of Supervisors has been in constant communication with representatives from the EPA on the continuing work on the Baghurst remediation efforts.
- Volunteers are needed to help plan the America250PA event in Upper Salford Park on October 10, 2026.
- A public thank you was expressed to the Folk Fest volunteers for their Clean-Up of the Park and the roads around the festival site on April 25th and to the Road Crew for picking up the bags that they collected.
- The Summer Concert in the Park Series is as follows: June 4th will be Bob T & the T-Bones, July 2nd will be The Mighty Manatees, and August 6th will be Mike Guldin and Rollin' & Tumblin'. Concerts are free to the public and start at 7pm at Upper Salford Park. Maureen Stacy was acknowledged for her generosity for sponsoring the bands in memory of her late husband, Jack.
- Bird Town PA educational materials were delivered and are available to the public.
- The Historical Society's Memorial Day Tribute is on May 25th at 7pm at Upper Salford Park.

The following **reports** were presented for the month of **April 2026**: State Police, Upper Salford Volunteer Fire Company, Special Fire Police, Plymouth Community Ambulance Association, Freedom Valley Medical Rescue, Planning Commission (Joint), Zoning Officer/Building Inspector, Road Superintendent, Solicitor, Historical Society, Residential Pumping Receipt Update, and the Auditors' Report.

On a motion made by Mr. Sacks and seconded by Mr. O'Donnell, the Board of Supervisors unanimously authorized the **Upper Salford Special Fire Police** to request assistance, should it be needed and to assist with the **Upper Salford Township Red, White, and Blue Parade** with traffic and crowd control on July 4, 2026, between 9am and 1pm.

On a motion made by Mr. Sacks and seconded by Mr. O'Donnell, the Board of Supervisors unanimously authorized the **Upper Salford Special Fire Police** to request outside assistance with traffic and crowd control on Thursday, August 13, 2026, during the arrival of campers for the **Philadelphia Folk Festival**, to request outside assistance with traffic and crowd control at the **Old Goshenhoppen Church 149th Annual Oyster Picnic** to be held on Saturday, September 12, 2026,

and to request outside assistance with traffic and crowd control at the **WMGK Bonfire** to be held on Saturday, October 3, 2026, from 3:30pm to 10:30pm.

On a motion made by Mr. Sacks and seconded by Mr. O'Donnell, the Board of Supervisors unanimously authorized the **Upper Salford Special Fire Police** to assist at **Towamencin Community Day** on May 30th, **Fairmont Fire Company of Lansdale Car Show** on June 20th, **Ambler Annual Fireworks Display** on July 2nd, and the **Mustang Barn 50th Anniversary Celebration at Upper Salford Park** on July 18th, if they choose and have the volunteers available.

On a motion made by Mr. Sacks and seconded by Mr. O'Donnell, the Board of Supervisors unanimously approved the bills for the month of May in the amount of \$118,765.05 for payment.

The receipts for the month of May totaled \$172,367.68.

The Treasurer's report as of May 12, 2026 noted the following amounts: total assets, \$11,751,723.21; total liabilities, \$331,861.03; total equity, \$11,419,862.18. Total liabilities and equity equal \$11,751,723.21.

On a motion made by Mr. O'Donnell and seconded by Mr. Sacks, the Board of Supervisors unanimously approved the minutes of the April 14, 2026 Board of Supervisors meeting, as submitted.

Public Comment:

- *Tom Brown, Old Skippack Road, inquired about an update on the Roundabout and whether the plantings have been discussed.*

On a motion made by Mr. O'Donnell and seconded by Mr. Sacks, the meeting adjourned at 8:11 p.m.
